COMPANION DOG SPORTS (CDSP)

You must register your dog. It can be done on line \$25.00 per dog.

Any b reed including mixed breeds and disabled dog may register. Note that the disabled dog must not be in any pain in order to enter a trial.

Leash & Collars: 6' leash required for Starter Novice

Collars: flat, buckle type, or limited slip martingale. No decorative items on collars.

Praise & Encouragement: Handler can praise and encourage their dog during and Between exercises. Praise must be calm, and pleasant.

Food: Handlers can reward their dog with food at the completion of an exercise after judge has said "exercise". It must be given **before the dog moves our of position and before the dog moves forward to the next exercise.** It must be kept hidden, 5points will be taken if handler drops food.

The program offers 5 levels of classes.

 Starter Novice (Nov.A) for dog who have never earned any obedience title in any registry.

On lead Heeling

On lead Figure 8

On lead Stand with Distraction (judge walks 2' away— around dog)

Off lead Recall (1/2 of ring)

Off lead Sit Stay (1/2 of ring)

B. Starter Novice B for dogs who have earned a Beginner Novice obedience

Title in any registry and do not have a qualifying score in Novice in any

C. Starter Novice C for dogs who have earned a CDSP Starter Novice in A or B class and do not have a qualifying score in Novice in any obedience registry.

 - 1. On-leash Heeling
 - 2. Off-leash Figure 8
 - 3. Moving Stand for Exam (6') judge touches dog)
 - 4. Recall over Bar Jump (walk 8 feet other side of jump/call dog to come front and finish)
 - 5. Sit/Down Stay (dog maintains a sit or down in the middle of the ring while handler walks around the perimeter of the ring and returns to heel position.
- Novice A for dogs who have never earned any other obedience title in any Registry.

- 3. Novice C for dogs who have earned a CDSP Novice title in either the A or B class.

<u>Tracking Test Report</u> <u>by Robin Scott</u>

The Obedience Club of Daytona held their Annual Tracking Test today - February 5th... Unfortunately only one entry was received -- and that one was an individual from Georgia who drove in yesterday to do the track this morning.

The day was absolutely prefect - cool and damp and just a tiny bit cloudy.

The dog entered was an English Springer Spaniel and this little girl worked her heart out and did a lovely job. Tracking posture was beautiful to watch. Unfortunately -- the last leg was 170 yards and she turned too early so the whistle had to be blown. But what a gracious handler - he had a smile on his face bent down and loved on his girl and thanked everyone for their work.

Now a little background on the test for those not familiar with tracking tests. The Judges for the test were Ron Seeley, some of you have shown in obedience to him --- and I was the other Judge. Luci Seeley was Chief Tracklayer that oversees the tracklayer. Since only one entry -- this was not as involved. Tricia Boychuk drove all the way from Jupiter area to be our tracklayer, at her own expense. Tricia has begun the journey to become a Tracking Judge and the requirements are laying a minimum of 10 tracks. We met to plot the track yesterday. Tracking Judges want the handler to succeed so Ron and I walked several areas to determine the best possible field to plot a track. Took us a couple of hours - but what better way to spend a beautiful afternoon with lovely weather than taking walks in fields.

Tracking is a sport that goes is spurts -- sometimes the tests fill with an alternate list - and sometimes there are only one or two entries. I am very hopeful next year more people will have certified and be able to enter. This year two additional people were eligible to enter - meaning their dog had certified but they missed the closing date so were unable to support our test. I know of a few people in the Ocala area who are training and almost ready for certification.

I want to specifically thank Pat Dean who has been the Test Secretary and Chair for the OCOD Tracking Test for a few years now. Pat works hard and if she has a question - she asks. Believe it or not - being the Test Secretary involves just as much work for one entry - and it does for four - the judging program, catalog, premium, paperwork for judges -- all the same.. So thank you Pat for doing an absolutely fabulous job.

Thank you to Ralph Orlando -- he made sure we had the flags to plot the track and a glove for the end article. Ralph is very knowlegeable in Tracking so is able to brief the membership at the meetings.

Thank you to Ralph, Janet Berry, Chris Franczek, and Andy Gibbons -- all volunteered to be tracklayers or carry flags but with only one entry -- we advised we had Tricia. Most clubs will always help a newbie in their journey to become a Judge whether it's tracking or obedience or any of the other events.

Last and certainly not least -- thank you to the Seeleys for giving up one of their very few free weekends to drive up and judge for us.

OBEDIENCE CLUB OF DAYTONA

GENERAL MEETING

FEBRUARY 13, 2023

President Michele Lemole called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. The sign in sheet was passed around twenty-one members were present. Two guests were at the meeting.

Ralph introduced Tim and Josh two officers from Daytona Beach Police Department K9 Unit and they started the meeting by answering questions from the OCOD members and guests. The officer said they are trained at the same time as the dog. When he got his dog they said here you go and handed the dog over to him and he was bitten in the first 30 seconds. When the officer was asked what his dog's favorite thing to do the answer was sleep. He said we don't usually work our dogs past 8 or 9 years old. One of their dogs is trained for apprehension, tracking and narcotics. The other officer's dog is trained for apprehension and tracking. Both dogs are very social and are taken periodically to visit children in elementary and middle schools. Pure bred dogs cost 10K with no previous training. The dogs are trained to grab the first thing they can get a hold of sometimes a leg or an arm. The dogs are like family members and sleep wherever they want and socialize with family members and other family dogs. When they travel and leave the hotel rooms to go to dinner they crate the police dogs they leave behind. If a relative comes into his house his dog wouldn't bother the family members. If someone broke into his house the dog would take appropriate action. They were setting up for a demo and explained that the sleeve for the dog to bite had an embedded metal bar so that if the dog was biting up and down the sleeve he would be able to grip something other than the arm. There was a lively demonstration with lots of training and chasing examples. They even showed how they could call off the dog in pursuit at the last minute. They carry two narcam one for the officer and one for the dog in case they are exposed to drugs that would be lethal. They have a great 24 hour emergency vet to take them to if there was a problem. They keep the dogs away from dangerous drugs if they are thrown from the crooks car. Many thanks to the Daytona Beach Police Department K9 Unit for taking the time to put on a wonderful program for our club.

Report of the Secretary: Applications for Membership - Midge Murphy (S) St. Augustine and Joy Hirshbeel (S) Deland. There was no correspondence.

Pat Dean said the Tracking Event was a great success even though we only had one entry and he failed. Pat Dean said this was her fifth year doing this and this is the first year she really got excited. The site was gorgeous! I encourage everybody to try their hand at it now. She appreciates everybody's help that volunteered to be track layers. Robin and Lucy are awesome. We couldn't have done it without them. Tricia wants to be a judge so she came and laid our tracks. You have to lay a certain amount of tracks to become a judge.


