




















The Scent Work Trial is September 15, 16, 17, 2023

The Joys and Responsibilities of OCOD Membership.

There is no time like summer to remind me how lucky we are to have our Training Center. However, having our own space means we must all contribute to it's upkeep. One member responsibility is to help keep the building clean and in good order. So, this is a refresher on what is expected of each member regarding building upkeep.

- 1. Members will participate in a minimum of two cleaning days per year one occurring January June and the second July December. If you live more than 45 minutes from the TC, you may vacuum, or clean bathrooms, or another assigned job when you are already there for class. If you only do <u>agility</u>, helping to clean and sort agility equipment counts for cleaning. Weekly set up and break down does not.
- 2. When present for cleaning (alone or with the group), each member will sign in on the CLEANING notebook that is on the Table near the front desk. This is the list we will use to determine who has met the cleaning requirement.

It takes a village to care for our building and we need everyone to do their part.



"Zibber" OA OAJ NF BCAT SWN SBA SCA SHDN THDA CGC died recently from Wobblers Syndrome. At OCOD, he participated in dog sports earning titles in Agility, Scent Work and FastCAT. He was also a therapy dog that regularly visited an assisted living facility earning his Advanced Therapy Dog title. He was adopted from Halifax Humane Society when he was about 3 years old and, for the last several summers ,he gave dog sport demonstrations as part of their summer camp program. Zibber was 11 years old.



List of Cleaning Duties at the Training Center

- The person who opens and closes the TC is in charge if Anna or Claire are not there.
- Vacuum all four rings plus the Puppy Room and the Agility ring, all walkways, hallways. Move crates vacuum and put back where they belong.
- Clean all four bathrooms and wash floors and replace toilet paper, hand soap and Paper towels as needed. Also, wash kitchen floor. (Supplies are in the utility room.)
- Clean tables outside of rings. If time allows clean obedience equipment and ring gating.
- Empty vacuums ,rinse out buckets and pails, put back where they belong.
- The blue scrubber and green scrubber are not to be used without permission from Claire Israelson or Anna Johnson.
- When closing the training center make sure all doors are locked, lights turned off and no water is running in sink or toilets and thermostat is turned back to 78 degrees.

GENERAL MEETING

AUGUST 14, 2023

President Michele Lemole called the meeting to order at 7:04pm and welcomed everyone to the club meeting. The sign in sheet had been passed around and 16 members were present. There was no correspondence.

Minutes of the last meeting were not read because they were published in the Chatterbarks newsletter.

Report of the Secretary: There were two new applications for membership: Margot Estrada (S) Port Orange and Mindy Rohr (S) Debary.

Michele said we are looking at improving our website redesigned to make it more user friendly. It's not android, I-phone or tablet friendly like the majority of people used today. We will be purchasing two more new tunnels for our agility trials. Chris will be calling the security camera person back because he has not returned her calls.

The club is going to raise the fees \$10 for non-members in 7 week classes starting in January 2024.

Andria brought information and questions from Ralph. Ralph has been speaking to one of the deputies in the Sheriff's department who is going to take a class here and he was telling the deputy how he would get the member's rate and upon completion of the course he would get a refund. The deputy would like to see that in writing so he could put it in the newsletter so everybody would know about it. Ralph could send him that in an e-mail but he would like to see the language we want him to use. Michele will contact Ralph with that. Back in early August a group of us from here went to Brown and Brown Insurance Company who was having an event for their employees. Five teams went Linda Bredlinger, Kelly Zen, Valerie Vetter, Ralph Orlando, and myself Andria Kelley. Brown and Brown was so impressed with us that they gave us a check for \$500. They were really nice to us. Ralph had arranged for us to go there. Everyone was so excited to hear about the check. Michele said we'll give this to Renee thank you!

Pet Insurance: Michele said we are going to get her take on what she researched regarding pet insurance. She is going to give her opinion on 3 plans. Please do your own research. A good place to go to is Forbes because they will show the best of pet insurance. They will break it down in categories like where you could get the best bang for your buck, best copayment, best coverage and so forth. Each plan is different. They do have pre-existing clauses so whatever your dog has wrong with him now will not be covered. The premium will depend on the age, the breed, and if your dog has pre-existing conditions. She focused on price and value, how much coverage it offered and if it covered things that were specific for her breed.

Her dog is 2 yrs. old, he is hell on wheels, does agility, and has the possibility to do something that will physically injure him. He is a Golden and they are prone to cancer so insurance covering cancer treatments are important to me. He also eats stuff that he shouldn't. They are also insurance companies that do not cover injuries for sport dogs. All plans have some sort of waiting period. If you haven't had a recent checkup they will require one. Orthopedic plans vary. If you want that coverage you would need to have a vet orthopedic evaluation. There are various waiting periods for insurance coverage also. There will be different levels of deduction options, co-payment options and you yearly coverage options.

There are plans that will offer you unlimited payments per year but it is very expensive per month. Call for a quote. The three plans I liked the best were AKC through Pet Partners, Embrace and Paw Protect which is actually a subsidiary of Embrace. AKC allowed you more choices. For their custom plan the most common deductible was \$250, 20% co-payment and a \$10,000 limit. AKC also has unlimited plans available. deductibles are annual, co-payments are per incident. Only AKC has breeder coverage. Some insurances cover only the dog's treatment fee and not the doctor's exam fee unless you add it to the policy. They have a lot of choices but you have to pay for those choices. There is a mixed breed option. Embrace has a direct deposit and will process in 10-15 days once the claim is approved. Embrace and Paw Protect cover physical therapy and dental trauma. Paw Protect also covers chiropractic and has care credit built in. This will help you take care of your animal while things get sorted out about the bill. All 3 policies do not cover spay or neuter services unless you added it to your coverage. Ask ahead of time if the vet will accept your insurance. Some vets don't take pet insurance. Michele said to look everything over and everything is what you need it to be before you sign a deal. She thinks she is going with Paw Protect because the coverage suited her. She asked if there was anything else. Terrie needs more volunteers for the Scent Work trial.
